# If God Is in Control, Then Why? Trusting a Just God in an Unjust World

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## I. Is God in Control?

- A. "Control" implies responsibility.
- B. One who is in control is responsible for the outcome of that which he controls.
- C. We observe that there is an abundance of sin, evil, and injustice on the earth.
- D. WHY is there an abundance of sin, evil, and injustice on the earth?
  - 1. Because God wants it so?
  - 2. Because He doesn't care?
  - 3. Because He is distant?
  - 4. Because He wants to teach us something through injustice and evil?
- E. If God is in control, then isn't He ultimately responsible for this sin, evil, and injustice?

#### II. Justice on the Earth: Four Positions

Position	Is God responsible?	Is this just?	Who believes this?

2	Yes	No	Unbelievers

# III. God Is Sovereign, But He Is NOT in Control!

A. Sovereignty versus control:

#### 1. Government by exercising Control:

- a. Control implies an absolute dominion over that which is governed, possessing supreme power and utilizing it in such a way as to ensure a particular outcome.
- b. Control is the process of governing through a manipulative power that forces people and circumstances to conform to the will of the one in control.
- c. Control ELIMINATES the will or choices of others and only recognizes one will—that of the one who exercises the control.

#### 2. Government by exercising Sovereign Authority:

- a. Sovereign Authority implies an absolute **ownership** of that which is governed.
- b. It is the state of being the highest authority, with submission to no higher authority.
- c. It possesses supreme power and utilizes it by subjecting power to legitimate **delegated authority**.
- d. Sovereignty recognizes the will and choices of all people.
- e. It therefore governs through delegated authority, offering choices with corresponding applied consequences.

#### B. God is not a controller, and He does not control anyone.

- 1. Example: Apartment lease analogy.
- 2. God is the owner.
- 3. Man is the lessee.
- C. We are neither Muslims nor fatalists who do believe that God is in control.
- D. In our current age, there is one thing that God lacks on earth. What is it?
  - 1. **Authority** was delegated to Adam and Eve. (Genesis 1:26–28)
  - 2. Man was made to rule over the earth. (Psalm 8:3-8)
  - 3. The earth has been given to men. (Psalm 115:16)

- 4. Man's (Adam's and Eve's) delegated authority on earth was so complete that they—not God—had authority to give the earth over to Lucifer.
  - a. And they did hand it over to Satan.
  - b. **Notice:** Jesus did not dispute this fact with Satan. (Luke 4:6–7)

#### IV. God Has Always Related to Man by Covenant

- A. God made a covenant with Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses and Israel, David, and finally with us by the blood of Messiah Jesus.
- B. There has always been a tension all throughout history as to whether man relates to God by works or by covenant.
- C. Definition of covenant: A unilateral, unconditional, irrevocable promise that shall not be broken.
- D. If you are a stranger to the covenant, even though you "have a covenant," it will not help you unless three things are true. (Ephesians 2:11–13)
- E. **Example:** Most Christians have been taught that the Passover in Egypt was about God skipping over the houses of the Israelites because of the blood on the door.
  - 1. This belies a total lack of understanding of **threshold covenant** and the **character of God**, but is commonly taught and believed.
  - 2. If you don't understand the blood covenant of Passover, you can't understand or apply to your life the blood covenant of Calvary.

#### V. The Current Battle Is Over God's Covenant Word on Earth

- A. There is a battle taking place on the earth for the destiny of individuals, families, and nations.
  - 1. The Word is settled in heaven. (Psalm 119:89)
  - 2. The battle is on earth. (Matthew 6:10)
- B. Satan governs the world system. (1 John 5:19)
- C. Jesus came to DESTROY the works of the devil. (1 John 3:8)
- D. Jesus sent us with His authority. (Matthew 28:19)

#### VI. Satan's Strategy: Create Disappointment in God Because of Injustice

A. Satan always wants to make God's actions look random.

- B. God always acts according to His covenant, not randomly. (Romans 4:1–5)
- C. Satan wants to get men to relate to God by works rather than by His covenant word.
- D. The longer you have walked with God, the more you think you have to offer Him.
  - 1. Job's false image of God. (Job 9:16–23)
  - 2. Job's "righteous statement." (Job 13:13–18)

## VII. We Are His Ambassadors of His Covenant on Earth

- A. Jesus sent us as His ambassadors. (John 20:21)
- B. Jesus' prayers were very short commands: "See! Walk! Be healed! Lazarus, come forth!"
- C. We are distributors and enforcers of His Covenant Word, so this is important:
  - 1. Learn the critical details of what a covenant is.
  - 2. Learn what authority our covenant with God gives you.
  - 3. Learn how to practically partner with God as His Covenant Ambassador on earth.
